HIKING

Nature lovers enjoy discovering unique geologic formations, as well as plant and animal life along the River Ridge, Ice Age, Hartman Creek State Park and numerous other local trails. The Waupaca County Forest located on Desert Road in the Town of Fremont, is an under developed site that contains three miles of hiking, horseback riding, skiing and snowmobile trails.

HUNTING

With thousands of acres of public hunting grounds and wetlands, the area is full of large and small game animals, game birds and waterfowl for both gun and archery hunting.

PHOTOGRAPHY

Beautiful scenery is everywhere for photo buffs to try out some new digital equipment or triedand-true film or video cameras.

PICNICKING

Area antique, craft and curio shops offer treasure hunters a wide variety of shopping experiences; unique artifacts, apparel, household goods, furnishings and collectibles.

SKATEBOARDING

The Waupaca Skate Park (Located inside Swan Park) accommodates skateboarders, in-line skaters and BMX bikers.

SNOWMOBILING

Waupaca County alone offers riders more than 400 miles of trails through woods and fields.

SOFTBALL

Fast-pitch, slow-pitch, men's, ladies and co-ed teams are abundant.

SWIMMING

There are two swimming beaches in Waupaca. They are at South Park and at Hartman Creek State Park. The Ramada by Wyndham Hotel & Conference Center, Comfort Suites and Econo Lodge have a pool for guests or are open to the public for a fee. The Community Fitness and Aquatic Center in Iola is also open to the public at affordable family rates. Swan Park in Waupaca and Manawa Area Veterans Freedom Park have splash pads.





TRAIN DEPOT

The historic Waupaca Railroad Depot, built in 1907, showcases Waupaca's railroad history. Located on an active railroad line, the Depot has been restored to its former grandeur and features an engineer's office, waiting room, model train display and numerous railroad artifacts. Free tours are available throughout the summer on Saturdays and Sundays, 12-5 p.m. The Depot is also open on summer holidays and for local festivals. The Depot is located at 525 Oak Street. 





ABBREVIATIONS & DEFINITIONS

BR - Boat Ramp. These are sites with a defined public boat launching facility which may or may not have parking.

BF - Barrier-free Boat Ramp. These sites have a boarding dock or means of wheelchair access to boats.

T - Walk-in Trail. These access sites are partially developed, excluding boat ramp, and are entirely within public lands.

R - Roadside. These sites do not include any access developments. Public roads with a marked right-of-way extending to the water provide a limited degree of access.

W - Wilderness in Public Ownership. A lake is in a wilderness area if there are no roads or buildings within 200 feet of the waterbody. Wilderness lakes have no defined walk-in trail to the water.

BW - Barrier-free Wilderness Access. These sites have a firm surface to gain access to the water, but no special piers or ramps.

NW - Navigable Water. Navigable access is provided by the presence of an inlet or outlet stream which furnishes adequate boat access to a lake. A small stream not large enough to float a boat does not provide effective navigable

Species of Fish - The relative abundance of various game fish species including muskellunge, northern pike, walleye, largemouth bass, smallmouth bass and panfish is listed. Abundance of a fish species is coded using the following symbols:

A = Abundant C = CommonP = Present

Slow No Wake

There is a "slow no wake" speed limit in effect on the following lakes on the Waupaca Chain O' Lakes: Dake, Miner, Sunset, Long Cove (a portion of Long Lake), Taylor, Otter, George, Bass, Nessling, McCrossen, Limekiln, Ottman, Beasley and the entire Upper Chain. State law also provides for a "slow no wake" limit in effect from 1/2 hour after sunset until sunrise on all lakes. Spencer Lake and Stratton Lake speed limits are "slow no wake", except during ski hours. Portions of the Wolf River are "slow no wake" and marked with buoys.

WAUPACA PARKS AND RECREATION FACILITIES

BRAINARDS BRIDGE PARK - 711 Bailey St

Located along the Waupaca River, much is kept in its natural splendor. This park has a shelter, electricity, water, restrooms, grills, playground and picnic area. This park is unique for its connecting iron bridges. This is an excellent photo area for weddings or portraits. This park also offers connection to the River Ridge Trail

BOWERSOX PARK - 490 Lakeside Pkwy

Located on Shadow Lake Road, this park provides parking for fishermen, small picnic area, and is where the fireworks are set off from for 4th of July and other community events.

ECO PARK- 1534 Webster Way

Eco Park programs are offered at the shelter periodically through the Parks and Recreation Center. Canoe access, open to the public, photo opportunity, playground equipment, trails.

LAKEMEN FIELD - 1211 Michigan St

This park is located on the east side of Waupaca off of Harding and Michigan Streets. Includes: lighted full size baseball field, small concession and bathroom building, small park maintenance building, drinking fountain, batting and pitching cage, gravel parking lot. Area also includes Leroy Haberkon lighted football field owned by school district.

JIM BOYER PARK - 502 Granite St

Located on the corner of Harrison Street and Granite Street, it boasts a large two tiered floral display with walk through and park benches.

POEHLMAN PARK - 215 Willard St

Located on Willard Street, this is a neighborhood style park which includes a small shelter, picnic area, playground and open space.

RASMUSSEN PARK - 129 Water St

Located at the north end of Main Street, this is an aesthetic park bursting with a colorful floral display, waterfall and permanent picnic table on top.

RIVERSIDE PARK - 1600 Royalton \$t

Located on the east side of town with an open play area, picnic areas, grills, horseshoe pits, shelter house, electricity, water, restrooms, sand volleyball court, playground and linkage to River Ridge Trail. This park offers canoe access to Waupaca River.

ROTARY RIVERVIEW PARK - 100 Cooper \$t

Located behind Main Street along the Waupaca River. Park offers a shelter, an open area, playground, picnic area and public stage area.

SCHWENN LYONS PARK - 108 N Division St

Located at the south end of N. Division Street, this is a small neighborhood style park with a picnic area and playground.

SERENITY PARK: 407 School St.

Located across from the Waupaca Senior Center, Serenity park is being developed as an accessible park that emphasizing the Waupaca River that runs through it. The park was designed by the members of the Senior Center and will be a point of interest for fishermen, artist and community members of all ages.

SHAMBEAU PARK: 879 N Oak St.

This park is located on the northeast side of town and includes a trail system that wraps around a beautiful quarry. This is a hidden gem within the City of Waupaca's park system.

SOUTH PARK - 921 5 Main St

Located between Mirror and Shadow Lakes at the south end of Main Street. The upper part offers our largest shelter, (with optional kitchen area with a refrigerator and sink available) grills, restrooms, electricity, water, playground, picnic area and access to beach with full supervision (includes diving dock and kiddy dock). The lower part offers a shelter, electricity, water, restrooms, grills, sand volleyball and access to fishing dock.

SWAN PARK - 909 Brainerds Dr

Located on Brainerd Road, this 140 acre park contains 3 lit and 1 unlit baseball/ softball fields, a shelter, bathrooms, concessions, large playground, trails, skateboard facility, 2 sand volleyball courts, T-ball area, 2 basketball courts, ample parking and sled hill. In the winter, there is an outdoor ice rink with a porta potty available during the season.

WASHINGTON STREET PARK - 420 N Washington St

Located at the end of North Washington St. Washington Park includes two picnic tables and acts as the west bookend of the Challenge the Outdoors Trail along the Waupaca River.

RIVER RIDGE NATURAL AREA - 1998 Godfrey Drive

River Ridge Natural Area is located east of Waupaca. Parking for trail access is across from Fox Valley Technical College on Godfrey Drive. The trail winds down a steep ravine and along the Waupaca River. There is also canoe access to the River on the east side of Hwy 22-54. This section of the River Ridge Trail has minimal improvements but is worth the trip to visit.

WAUPACA RECREATION CENTER - 407 School St

The Rec Center was formerly owned by the Waupaca School District. It was purchased & remodeled in 2004. There are two full sized gyms, large exercise/meeting room, several small meeting rooms, locker rooms with showers and a computer lab. The lower level is home base for the Senior Center and senior activities are held throughout the building. Gyms are available to rent for parties and special events. The building is also used for community events, Youth Center activities, offers open recreation hours for the public, adult and youth programs.



The unincorporated Village of King was named in 1941 in honor of Brigadier General Charles King, famed Wisconsin soldier and author.

Charles King was born in Albany, New York in 1844 to a wealthy and well-known family. His father, Rufus King, came to Wisconsin in 1845 and established the Milwaukee Sentinel. When the Civil War erupted, Rufus King helped to organize the famous Iron Brigade. Charles was attending Columbia University Prep School in New York City, but convinced his father to help him gain admittance to West Point and soon he was appointed by Abraham Lincoln to West Point.

Upon graduation, Charles became a Civil War lieutenant. In 1871, he was transferred to the Fifth U.S. Cavalry. During the Indian Wars, he was seriously wounded by an arrow in his left eye and by a bul let in hisleft arm. Charles was promoted to captain shortly before being d ischargedfor wounds in 1879. Upon returning to Wisconsin, King joined the University of Wisconsin staff becoming the cadet militia drill instructor and in 1880 King helped organize the Wisconsin National Guard.

During the Spanish-American War, King was called back to serve as a brigadier general and served in the Philippine Insurrection and in WWI.



His remarkable 70 year career serving in five wars: Civil War, Indian War, Spanish-American War, Philippine Insurrection and WWI, gave Charles the longest term in American military history. Charles King died at the age of 89 in 1933. During his lifetime, King also authored 60 books and approximately 250 articles dealing with life in the Frontier Army, Civil War, Spanish-American War and related human interest stories. So now when you think of King, Wisconsin, you might also be reminded of Brigadier General Charles King, the famed soldier and author.






