Prepare for severe weather in Waushara County

April 8th through April 12th is Severe Weather week in Wisconsin. This annual campaign encourages everyone to prepare for the tornadoes and severe storms the Wisconsin frequently experiences during the spring and summer months. It is also an opportunity for all of Wisconsin to participate in statewide tornado drills at 1:45 p.m. and 6:45 p.m. on April 11. Wisconsin averages 23 tornadoes per year. In 2023 the National Weather Service confirmed 21 tornadoes touched down in Wisconsin.

During the drill times, Wisconsin's National Weather Service offices will conduct NOAA Weather Radio tests that can be heard only if you are actively listening to those devices or have one programmed to activate on test alerts. Waushara County will test their outdoor warning sirens during the drill times and local media may also put out messages to encourage people to participate.

Schools, businesses, and people at home are encouraged to practice going to their nearest tornado shelter during the drills, as if there were an actual tornado warning in effect.

If there is a threat of severe weather in Wisconsin on April 11, the statewide drills will be postponed until Friday, April 12. The drill will go on in all other conditions, including non-severe weather (clouds, rain, dark sky, scattered thunderstorms, etc.). If severe weather is also expected on Friday, the drill will be cancelled.

Have a Plan at Home, at Work, and When You're Away

In a home or building, move to a pre-designated shelter, such as a basement, and get under a sturdy table or the stairs. A specially constructed "safe room" within a building offers the best protection.

If a basement is not available, move to a small interior room on the lowest floor and cover yourself with anything close at hand: towels, blankets, pillows. If possible, get under a sturdy table, desk or counter. Put as many walls as possible between you and the storm. Stay away from windows.

If caught outdoors, seek shelter in a sturdy building. If you cannot quickly walk to shelter, get into a vehicle, buckle your seatbelt and drive to the closest sturdy shelter. If flying debris occurs while you are driving, pull over and park. Now you have two options as a last resort:

- Stay in the vehicle with the seatbelt on and place your head below the windows.

- If you can safely get noticeably lower than the roadway, exit the vehicle and lie in that

area, covering your head with your hands. Do not seek shelter under an overpass.

Mobile homes, even if tied down, offer little protection from tornadoes. You should leave a mobile home and go to the designated storm shelter or the lowest floor of a sturdy nearby building.

Make sure you have multiple ways to receive weather information. A NOAA Weather Radio,

access to local TV, and smart phone apps can keep you informed when severe weather threatens.

Lloyd Edwin Everson

August 17, 1933 - March 31, 2024



Lloyd Edwin Everson, age 90, of Brushville, passed away peacefully at home under hospice care, surrounded by his family on Sunday, March 31, 2024.

He was born August 17, 1933, at home in the Township of New Hope in Portage County, WI, the oldest son of Elmer and

Ovella Behnke Everson. Lloyd was a 1951 graduate of Weyauwega High School and attended UW-Madison Dairy School in 1951. On May 25, 1957, he was united in marriage to Genevieve C. Hoeft at Borth Evangelical United Brethren Church. They raised five children together.

Lloyd was a sixth-generation cheesemaker, learning the trade from his father at Brushville Cheese Factory. He purchased Alder Creek Cheese Factory in Fremont in 1956. He sold it in 1974 but continued to manage it until going to work for Weyauwega Milk Products in 1975. In 1995, Lloyd was given the prestigious award of First Place U.S. Top Cheesemaker of World Champion Cheddar for Weyauwega Milk Products.

He loved bowling for over 70 years, always chasing that elusive 300 game, never quite making it (but he did hit 289 four times in his pursuits). Lloyd loved fishing on his pontoon on Lake Poygan, always telling his family about "the one that got away". He was proud of his 1956 Crown Victoria and was a member of the Crown Victoria Association. Lloyd was a Board of Director for Bethany Home in Waupaca, a member of American Bowling Congress (ABC), and also active at First Lutheran Church in Poy Sippi, serving as past treasurer and on the Church Council.

Lloyd is survived by his wife of almost 67 years, Genevieve Everson; his children, Douglas Everson, Karen (Arlen) Peters, Joan Everson (her Shih Tzu, Spirit), Judy (Randy) Moeller and Dennis (Gregory Smith) Everson; six grandchildren, Elizabeth (Jonathan Roy) Everson, Jennifer (Hunter) Brown, Nathan (Olivia) Peters, Aaron (Meghan) Peters, Joel Moeller (significant other, Kristen Gehring) and Rachel Moeller (significant other, Jared Jaeger); five great-grandchildren, Natasha Everson Roy, Madison Brown, Henry Peters, Caroline Peters and Grace Peters; two brothers, James (LaVonne Handrich) Everson and Thomas (Karen) Everson; one sister, Jane (Hugh) Jones; many beloved nieces, nephews and great-nieces and nephews; and former daughter-in-law, Peggy Crane. The School District of Westfield is committed to meeting the needs of our students and families through strategic reconfiguration and programming enhancements. Following careful consideration and community input, the district has approved two significant changes aimed at optimizing resources and providing a more comprehensive educational experience.

First, the relocation of the 6th grade to the current Middle School for instruction has been approved, starting in the 2024-25 school year. This decision, supported by community feedback, financial projections, enrollment data, and curriculum alignment, allows for the reconfiguration of learning spaces and enhances student programming. With a projected enrollment of 75 students, this transition will have a neutral financial impact from a staffing perspective while providing greater opportunities for our middle school students.

In conjunction with the relocation of the 6th grade, the district has also recommended implementing all-day, everyday 4K programming at our elementary schools. This move is seen as a seamless transition, made possible by the recent approval of

the 6th-grade relocation, and offers an opportunity to enhance educational offerings. Research consistently demonstrates the positive impact of early childhood education on cognitive development and school readiness. By offering all-day, everyday 4K, we aim to provide our youngest learners with a more comprehensive educational experience, setting a strong foundation for their future academic success.

Moreover, the introduction of all-day, everyday 4K programming aligns with our commitment to meeting the evolving needs of our community and supporting families. Offering all-day, every day 4K can alleviate childcare concerns for parents while also potentially supporting an increase in enrollment and enhancing school programming. We also recognize that all-day, everyday programming may not meet the needs of every family's preference. The District will be flexible with families and our 4K learners in establishing their school weekly plan.

These strategic decisions not only benefit our students but also reflect our dedication to fostering a positive and supportive learning environment for all of our learners. If you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to reach out to me or your student's building principal.

Recovery rebate credit deadline is May 17

Electronic filing and direct deposit options allow taxpayers to conveniently submit their return and receive their refunds much more quickly than paper filing.

Trout Stream Reflections

It was the long overdue welcome sound of rain, that slow and steady reverberating pattern of pats and drips, gently stirred by a southwestern breeze that trout fishers sensed with relief. The heavy clouds promised a lingering drizzle with sufficient stamina to last a day or so; even the weather radar said it would be so. What was given, the Central Sands rapidly took in like a huge sponge.

The rainfall was distributed in a subterranean fashion lifting the water table and directing new groundwater into seepage ponds and lakes. The elevated hills of the Johnstown

Moraine gathered rainfall into their elevated reservoir, which over time, will meter a flow of groundwater into trout stream headwaters. Headwaters are the point of origin of all our trout creeks and rivers and in essence are therefore the origin of our local trout populations. The refreshment of spring brought the continuation of renewed life to our landscape.

A bit further east along the Lake Michigan coast, steelhead waited off-shore beyond the nearly empty mouths of tributaries for a spring freshet to surge into the lake. Overnight and the following day, rainfall caused river flows to



increase by a factor of seven times carrying the homing scent steelhead sought as they searched for their natal spawning beds.

Regional fishers, attuned to local conditions, no doubt walked riverbanks in early morning hoping for success while peering into turbid waters the color of a cardboard box. Unfortunately local agricultural fields release soils unprotected by rooted vegetation. The following day,

though, brought success as impatient steelhead bounded upstream well adapted to the pressures of surging rivers, to find and spawn in washed gravel beds.

Fortunately in the Central Region agricultural erosion is less common and streams do not experience flash floods since rainfall is quickly absorbed and laterally distributed through groundwater pathways. In fact a little stream turbidity does provide concealment for

fishers, especially when combined with a cloudy day, yields a fishers bounty.

While spring feels good, this year it has a strangeness about it as spring follows a non-winter. Temperatures have been unseasonable warm and are rushing events. The hatch charts that mark the usual dates of aquatic insect emergence from trout streams) appear to be in need of re-setting for spring and summer. Several fellow fishers report the Grannom caddisfly adults are emerging from trout waters now, at least two or more weeks early.

The Grannom hatch, sometimes called the Black Caddis hatch, is an event not to miss. The picture accompanying this article displays a

Grannom and a fly design that usually works to fool trout. Perhaps it is best to re-wind our charts to earlier dates for the subsequent hatches of spring and summer.

The hatch I am most careful not to miss is the Hexagenia limbata hatch which I fish in one of the best rivers in Central Wisconsin, the Lehgs Adfig River (sorry, I always have trouble with the spelling).

So I am going to re-set my hatch calendar two weeks ahead and watch out for the Brown Drake mayfly hatch which is a harbinger of the Hexagenia hatch. These drakes emerge a week before Hex emerge. In the meantime let us enjoy the spring rains, earliest of May flow-ers and a risen renewal of spring - an Easter renewal.

Share turkey season with family and friends this spring

The Department of Natural Resources (DNR) encourages hunters to invite friends and family members to join the hunt this spring turkey hunting season.

Turkey hunting in Wisconsin is a wildlife management success story. Once absent from the state, turkey populations are stable after increasing steadily for decades. Because of this, Wisconsin offers more than 245,000 spring turkey harvest authorizations in all seven time periods of the season,

along with bonus harvest authorizations.

Hunting in Wisconsin provides a meaningful connection to wildlife and the outdoors. Many hunters enjoy that turkey hunting connects them directly to a food source. Spending a day in the woods during the season provides an excellent opportunity to view Wisconsin's wildlife and understand and appreciate the hunters' passion for pursuing the wild turkey. Taking a friend or family member along on your hunt,

even if just to watch the process, is a great way to help get a new hunter interested in the sport.

Knowing turkey hunting techniques, season dates, regulations and safety standards can help foster safe practices while enjoying Wisconsin's wild places this spring.

If you plan to introduce someone to hunting, urge the importance of completing a hunter safety education class. Early spring is the ideal time to find local courses. New hunters

can also participate in the Learn to Hunt Turkey program, which includes classroom portions focused on safety, scouting and biology and ends with a one-on-one mentored hunt.

If a new hunter is not able to complete a hunter safety course before the season, the Mentored Hunting program allows novices to hunt within arm's reach of a mentor. Mentors must be over the age of 18, hold a valid safety certificate or be exempt from needing one and have a valid

hunting approval.

New hunters not participating in the DNR's Mentored Hunting program will need to complete a hunter safety education class before heading to the field alone.

What to know about lynch syndrome

While it is impossible to change our genes, with knowledge comes power. In the case of Lynch syndrome, a genetic condition that can increase a person's risk for developing colorectal and other types of cancer, that's especially true.

Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month offers a reminder for everyone to examine their risk for colorectal cancer and to explore options for screening, as well as genetic testing, when recommended.

Lynch syndrome puts a person at a higher risk of developing colorectal, uterine, and ovarian cancer, explained ThedaCare Genetic Counselor, Emma Herlache. It's also associated with other cancers, including kidney, stomach, bladder, brain, prostate and pancreatic.

"Having Lynch syndrome is not a guarantee

that a person will get a cancer," explained Herlache. "What we do know is that the chances are higher."

Genetic testing is the only way to confirm whether someone has Lynch syndrome.

"What I tell my patients is in genetics, we are the 'why' people," Herlache said. "We're trying to help explain why a person might have been diagnosed with cancer very young, or why there is a high prevalence of cancer within a family. The goal is to use that information to be proactive for the future."

Pursuing Genetic Testing

People who are diagnosed with colon cancer or another Lynch syndrome-related cancer before age 50 should consider genetic testing for Lynch syndrome, Herlache said. Some guidelines also suggest anyone with colorectal cancer, diagnosed at any

age, could consider testing for Lynch syndrome.

Others who should consider testing include:

People who have a close family member diagnosed before age 50 with a Lynch syndrome-related cancer

People who have had two Lynch syndrome-related cancers

People who have three or more family members with a Lynch syndrome-related cancer (at any age)

"Confirming whether someone has Lynch syndrome can help individuals and their families in several ways," Herlache said.

First, it can impact the type of treatment people receive, as those who have Lynch syndrome may respond better to immunotherapy than those who don't.

Second, because Lynch syndrome increases the risk for multiple types of cancer, making the diagnosis can help guide what

kinds of other cancer screenings a person may need.

Third, if there is a genetic risk factor in a patient, then it has implications for their family members as well. A positive genetic test result opens the opportunity for other family members to be tested. Herlache explained that if those family members have the same inherited risk factor, they may be eligible for earlier and/or more frequent cancer screenings, as well as other preventive steps, in certain cases.

"When it comes to the topic of genetic testing, the best place to start is a discussion with a primary care provider," Herlache said. "Many times, that will result in a referral to a genetic counselor."

People also can self-refer to a ThedaCare genetic counselor. Genetic counseling begins with a discussion of an individual's medical and

family history.

Individuals do the test via a saliva sample or blood draw, and the specimen goes to a genetic testing laboratory. It takes about three to four weeks to get results back. Genetic counselors will then walk patients through the results. Herlache stressed that genetic counselors are there to provide support and help guide next steps.

"The results will let people know if they are at increased risk for cancer, and should consider additional or earlier screening," said Herlache. "The genetic counselor is there to help you work through any concerns regarding the results, and help develop a care plan."

Colorectal Cancer Screening

A colonoscopy is an excellent test because in many cases, physicians can identify precancerous polyps and remove them before they

turn into cancer. While other testing options are available, a colonoscopy is the best method for people at an increased risk, Herlache said.

Guidelines call for the general population to begin colonoscopy screenings at age 45 and to repeat it every 10 years through age 75.

For people with a family history of colorectal cancer, doctors may recommend beginning screening earlier. In addition, those individuals may need to repeat screening every five years instead of 10, Herlache noted. People with Lynch syndrome may begin colonoscopies as early as age 25 and repeat them every one to two years.

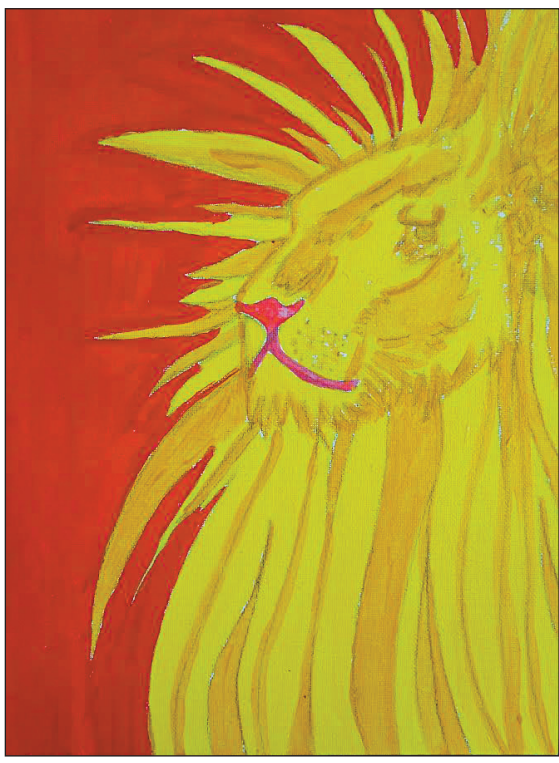

Fatal motor vehicle crash reported in Adams County

On Friday, March 29, at approximately 10:52 a.m., the Adams County Sheriff's Office received a 911 call advising of a two vehicle accident involving a truck and a semi with injuries in the area of STH 13 and CTH K, Township of Dell Prairie, Adams County.

Arriving deputies and first responders attempted to gain access to the driver of the truck but due to the significant damage were unable to do so. Kilbourn Fire Department arrived with extrication equipment and extricated the driver of the truck.

Dells-Delton EMS personnel along with first responders attempted life saving measures on the driver. Arrangements were made for a Medflight medical helicopter to respond and land near the accident scene.

Deputies were informed by EMS personnel that the driver and sole occupant of the truck succumbed to his injuries before being transferred to the medical helicopter. The driver of the truck was identified by his Wisconsin Driver's License as Shannon Deshannon,

age 50, of Wisconsin Dells.

The initial investigation revealed the semi was traveling southbound on STH 13 and the truck was traveling northbound on STH 13. The truck crossed the centerline into the southbound lane of travel. The semi driver attempted to avoid the truck by going towards the west shoulder of the roadway. The truck continued into the southbound lane of travel and collided with the semi.

This crash remains under investigation and no further information

will be released at this time. The Wisconsin State Patrol's Technical Reconstruction Unit (TRU) responded to the scene and conducted a reconstruction of the scene.

The Adams County Sheriff's Office was assisted by the Adams County Medical Examiner's Office, Wisconsin Dells Police Department, Kilbourn Fire Department, Dells-Delton EMS, Adams County Highway Department, Medflight, Zeman's Towing, Harper's Towing and the Wisconsin State Patrol.

Powerball jackpot raised to \$1 Billion for April 3 drawing

March 30 Powerball drawing includes \$150,000 wins in Wautoma and Lancaster

On April 1 the estimated Powerball jackpot drawing was raised to \$1 billion. The prize ranks as Powerball's fifth-largest jackpot ever.

While no one in Wisconsin won the Powerball jackpot over the weekend, three big Powerball wins took place following the March 30 drawing.

Winning \$150,000 Powerball tickets were sold at Family Fil on W7711 State Rd. 21 in Wautoma and at Kwik Trip on 939 N. Madison St. in Lancaster. Both plays added the \$1 Power Play to their tickets turning \$50,000 wins into \$150,000 because of the 3X multiplier.

In addition to the \$150,000 winners, a

winning \$50,000 Powerball ticket was sold at Town and Country Mart on 2050 Hwy MM in Fitchburg.

The winning \$150,000 and \$50,000 tickets matched four of five numbers (12-13-33-50-52) plus the Powerball (23).

Big Powerball wins in Wisconsin have been frequent in 2024. Following Saturday's winners, 14 winning tickets of \$50,000 or more have been sold this year in the Badger State, including seven winning tickets in March.

The Powerball jackpot has been inching closer and closer to a billion since the beginning of the year. The jackpot was last hit on New

Year's Day in Michigan by a ticket that won an \$842.4 million jackpot.

The April 1 drawing will be the 39th drawing in the jackpot run. Powerball's longest stretch without a jackpot winner is 41 consecutive drawings, which has happened twice before.

Players have 180 days from the draw date to claim their winnings. Information on how to claim a prize is available at wilottery.com/winners/claim-prize. Players can also check their tickets using the Wisconsin Lottery mobile app, available on the App Store or Google Play.

Wisconsin Lottery retailers who sell winning tickets over \$599 receive

a two percent Retailer Performance Winning Ticket Incentive, up to \$100,000.

Powerball drawings are Monday, Wednesday, and Saturday at 9:59 p.m. Tickets must be purchased before 9 p.m. to be included in a drawing. Powerball tickets are \$2 per play, with the option to buy the Power Play feature for \$1.

The odds of winning a \$50,000 Powerball prize are 1:913,130. For the \$1 Power Play add-on option, the odds of a 3X multiplier being drawn on Saturday night were 1:3.3. Power Play does not apply to the jackpot.

The odds of winning the Powerball jackpot are 1:292,201,338.
