#1 Visit Keyes Peak Ski Hill

Take a trip to Keyes Peak Ski Hill to enjoy downhill skiing, snow tubing, snowshoeing and cross country skiing. Not only

will you enjoy winter fun with the whole family, you can enjoy panoramic views from the highest peak in Florence County. The Keyes Peak Recreation Area is county owned and operated. For more information, contact Florence County Forestry and Parks at 715-528-3207 or go to www.exploreflorencecounty.com

#2 Cross-Country Ski Trails Florence County

The rolling terrain on the Lake Emily Cross Country Ski Trail is best suited for skiers with a moderate amount of experience. The trail travels 2.5 miles in a large loop through the beautiful forest which lies in close proximity to Lake Emily.

The Lauterman Lake Trail includes steep terrain giving this trail system a medium to high difficulty level as you trek 9 miles through the Nicolet National Forest. Hall's Creek Trail includes gentle rolling terrain on the 7 mile loop with a difficulty rating which is low.

#3 Marinette County

Woods Road Ski Trail - Probably the most unique ski trail around, the Woods Road Ski Trail offers stations along the trail to tell about the many animals found in the area. The mostly flat landscape offers many loop options and is approximately 6 miles long, a great place for beginners and children. Spring Rapids and Seymour Rapids Trails - Both trails include

steep hills, breathtaking views and peacefulness. Spring Rapids is the larger of the two trails and is comprised of various loops and distances. This trail is groomed for both classic and skate skiing. Pets, hiking and snowshoeing are not allowed on the groomed ski trails. The Peshtigo River Trail is an 11-mile trek in the wetland habitat in the Lower Peshtigo River. The trail extends from the city of Peshtigo to Green Bay, the same path that loggers, early explorers and tribes used as their main route for travel and shipment of goods.



#4 Snowmobile & ATV in Florence & Marinette Counties

The breathtaking scenery, well maintained trails, rolling hills, endless miles of rivers and streams, tall pines and beautiful hardwoods; these are what snowmobilers in Florence and Marinette Counties will enjoy. Sled on nearly 1000 miles of trails between Florence and Marinette Counties.

Take a stop by one of the many waterfalls accessible by snowmobile for a unique winter experience. State Corridors 1, 3, 5, 7, and 18 cross Marinette County and meet up with the 25,000 miles state trail system. Also, Marinette County is one of the few counties in the state to offer year-round ATV trail access. For trail conditions and reports, go to www.therealnorth.com.

#1 Snowmobile & ATV Trails

Forest County offers over 400 miles of groomed trails.

100 Mile Snow Safari Trail: The 100 Mile Snow Safari has approximately 150 miles of marked and groomed trails through the Nicolet National Forest linking all the localities of Forest County. Maps, food, etc., are available at pit stops throughout the system. **Lumberjack Memorial Trails:** The Lumberjack Memorial Trails Club grooms and maintains over 90 miles of trails in central and southern Forest County. These trails link to the 100 Miler as well as to the trails in the Lakewood area. **Three Lakes/Brule River Trails:** The Three Lakes/Brule River Trail system has over 80 miles of groomed trails in the Nicolet National Forest, linking northern Forest County to Florence, Vilas, and Oneida Counties, as well as upper Michigan trails. **Tombstone-Pickerel Trails:** The Tombstone-Pickerel Trails include over 20 miles of groomed trails in southwestern Forest County, with numerous pit stops and resorts, as well as a link to the Langlade County trail system. **Black Bear Sportsmen's Club:** The Black Bear Club is Forest County's newest snowmobile club, with over 40 miles of groomed trails, linking the Crandon area north and west to trails in Oneida County. For further information and maps go to www.forestcountywi.com.

#2 Cross Country Skiing

Grab your cross-country skis or a pair of snowshoes to explore the trails in Forest County. Three trails meander through the Nicolet National Forest; Ed's Nicolet North, and Anvil. Ed's Lake Trail is located on County Highway W between Wabeno and Crandon. The trail is groomed with a 2.3 mile loop trail suitable for beginners. The intermediate trail portion offers a 2.7 mile loop as well as a 3.5 mile loop. Nicolet North Trail is located 10.5 miles east of Eagle River. There are 13 miles of groomed trails with several loop opportunities. The Anvil Trail is located just 8.5 miles east of Eagle River on Highway 70. There are 12 miles of groomed loop trails ranging from gentle, rolling to hilly. Otter Springs Trail is located 4 miles east of Crandon off Highway 8 on Forest Road. This trail has a parking area and ski shelter available. It offers a 1.2 mile loop and .75 mile loop suitable for beginners. The intermediate trail is a 3 mile loop. Hemlock Lake Ski Trail is 1 mile east and 4 miles south of Crandon on Hemlock Lake Road. This is a 2 mile loop trail with parking area.

#3 Ice Fishing

Forest County has over 820 lakes totaling more than 21,500 acres. Grab your tip-ups and head out to catch panfish, small-mouth bass, largemouth bass, pike, and muskies.

#1 Snowmobile and ATV Trails
Langlade County provides an abundance of opportunities for everyone to enjoy snowmobiling. In the winter months there are over 500 miles of beautifully groomed snowmobile and ATV trails. These trails are maintained for the enjoyment and use of the public by 10 different local clubs and Langlade County. The County of Trails offers winter enthusiasts a beautiful ride through varying terrain including forests of beautiful hardwoods as well as frozen lakes and open fields.

#2 Cross-Country Ski & Snowshoe Trails

Most of the trails are double tracked. A trail map is located at the trailhead. The Nicolet State Trail in Oconto County begins in the town of Gillett near the Oconto/Shawano county line. The trail runs for about 30 miles north from Gillett in Oconto County and passes through the communities of Suring, Mountain, Lakewood and Townsend. The Quartz Hill Trail has two sections, one located on the east and one on the west side of State Highway 32. The east section leads across a boardwalk to the top of McCaslin Mountain. It has moderately steep sections, but the view from the top of this quartz rock outcrop is worth the climb. Along the trail to the top, you will pass a quartz crystal deposit with an informational sign which describes how early Indians came here to quarry quartz to create their tools. The west portion of this trail leads to the site of the Carter Fire Lookout Tower.

#1 Take a Tour

Tour the Northwoods Wildlife Center and meet the residents that include reptiles, amphibians, raptors and scavengers. Admission is free, but donations are appreciated. The Center focuses on wildlife rehabilitation, education and research. For winter enthusiasts, visit the International Snowmobile Hall of Fame. Dedicated to preserving and showcasing the rich and exciting history of snowmobiling at both the recreational and competitive levels, the hall of fame includes museum, hall of fame and library for the sport. Annual inductions honor the men and women that have played significant roles at the racing venues, design and manufacturing arenas, local clubs, state associations and national organizations. Visit the Three Lakes Winery. Three Lakes Winery has been making the Original Cranberry Wine since 1972. Try one or several of their nearly two dozen varieties of wine.

#2 Cross-Country Ski, Snowshoe and Bike

Oneida County is home to some of Wisconsin's best cross-country and snowshoe trails catering to everyone from beginners to advanced skiers. Here is a guide to the beautiful Oneida County trail system.

The Cassian County Two-Way trail is a flat to moderately rolling, groomed classic track. The CAVOC Trails are geared toward advanced beginner to expert with hilly terrain. High and low ROPEs courses are available. The Enterprise County Ski/Hiking Trail is appropriate for beginners to intermediate with some hilly terrain. Holiday Trails on Long Lake are comprised of Intermediate terrain, snowshoeing, hiking and groomed cross-country ski trails. This trail joins the CAVOC trails. Holiday Trails:

Old Farm Trail terrain is suitable for beginner to intermediate. Madeline Trail sports easy to moderate terrain, some rolling hills. The McNaughton trail offers gentle terrain with very few steep hills. Separate skating and diagonal ski trails. A trail pass is required for skiing. The Minocqua Winter Park offers amenities including a heated chalet with café, day lodge and indoor waxing area. Trails difficulties range from beginner to advanced. Groomed cross-country ski trails. Snowshoeing allowed on designated trails. A trail pass is required and can be purchased on-site. Northwoods Ski Trails are well suited for beginner to intermediate skiers with a one-kilometer skate trail on steep hills for the adventurous expert skier. Nose Lake Trail - Beginner/intermediate terrain. Five and nine mile loops for hiking and cross-country skiing, groomed cross-country ski trails. A trail pass required for skiing. Raven Nature Trail is a moderately hilly trail with some steep hills. Trail pass required for skiing. Razorback Ridges - Difficult as well as fairly easy trails for beginners. Trails are marked as

to their degree of difficulty. Look for lots of twists and turns as well as a good deal of variety over the 12 miles of trails. Rhinelander Community Ski Trails – Beginner to intermediate terrain on groomed trails. The Sam Campbell Memorial Trail includes gently rolling trails with some steep grades. Especially good for snowshoeing with ungroomed cross-country ski trails. Schlect Ski Trails offer moderate terrain with groomed cross-country skiing. Trail pass is required. Lighted nightly during winter. Three Eagle Trail is mostly level with some gently rolling terrain. Cross-country skiing; diagonal & skating as well as snowshoeing. Groomed cross-country ski trails. Washburn Lake Trail - Hilly terrain, intermediate to advanced. Separate ski and snowshoe trails. Groomed for skating and diagonal skiing. Single track bike trails. Heated shelter available at Perch Lake trail head. Trail pass required for skiing, biking and snowshoeing. Almon Park Trail is suited for beginner or intermediate skiers, hiking and snowshoeing. A trail pass is required for snowshoeing. No bikes are allowed. Shannon Lake Trail - Incredibly scenic with a mix of easy/beginner and intermediate loops. Gently rolling trail meanders through a variety of northern hardwoods. The loop around Shannon Lake is especially scenic. Loops range from 2.3, 3.5 to 7 miles. Madeline Lake Trail - A variety of beautiful scenery winding around three lakes. A shelter with a fire ring is provided. This designated mountain bike trail and tracked cross-country ski trail require a Wisconsin State Trail Pass. Fallison Lake Trail - Beautiful, hilly trail, with a spectacular view of Fallison Lake. Ungroomed loops of .5, 1.0, 2.0 and 2.5 miles. Holmboe Nature Preserve - Widely varied terrain for snowshoeing.

#3 Snowmobile Trails

One of the top snowmobiling destinations in North America, the trail system consists of almost a thousand miles of top-notch trails running throughout the county. With over five feet of annual snowfall, the fantastic trails can keep you riding during your getaway. The Northwoods Passage



grooms trails from Rhinelander to Tomahawk, north to Minocqua, and south to the Gleason trails. The Hodag Sno-Trails Club maintains the East side of Rhinelander from Rhinelander to Pelican Lake, Sugar Camp and Monico. This area includes the scenic wilderness area of the Enterprise Trail System. 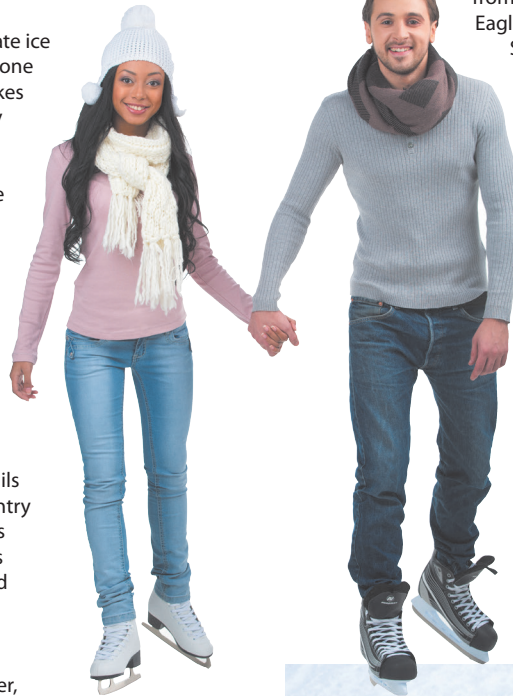

#3 Cross-Country Ski & Snowshoe Trails

An avid sports enthusiast or a just enjoying a day on the trails, Vilas County's groomed trails offer both skating and classic-style cross-country skiing as well as opportunities for snowshoers out on a trek.. With a mix of public forest trails and service group maintained trails, you'll find hundreds of miles of trails groomed for both skating and classic-style cross-country skiing. Anvil Lake Trail - Terrain varies from mostly level to hilly. Trail difficulty is marked (beginner, intermediate, expert). The trail showcases the many opportunities provided within the National Forest. Mud Minnow Lake Trail - This segment of the Vilas County Forest Trail System winds through a variety of timber types including oak, pine, and aspen/birch. Although the trails may be enjoyed through the winter season, the Sunken Lake Road and Mud Minnow Lake Road are not plowed. Mud Minnow Lake Road serves as a segment of the Vilas County Snowmobile Trail System. Nicolet North Trails - These trails offer a favorite spot for cross-country skiers, hikers and mountain bikers. A parking lot (sticker required) is located on the west side of the trailhead. Part of the Nicolet National Forest, these trails connect to the Anvil Lake Trail. Length of the Nicolet North is 15 miles. Nordmarka Trails - This 3 mile system offers easy/beginner and intermediate ski opportunities along with some hills and is maintained by the Nordmarka Ski Club of Eagle River. Ski Hill Trails - As part of the Vilas County Forest Hunter/Hiking Trail System, this trail is mowed on a three-year rotation to maintain access and improve wildlife habitat. Gentle terrain is featured on this trail system which traverse through stands of aspen, pine, oak, and hardwoods. The first .25

Wisconsin Snowmobile Information

Snowmobile registrations are required for operation of any snowmobile within the state (unless exempt), and the registrations decals must be properly displayed.

Trail Passes & Registration

A snowmobile registration certificate is valid for 2 years beginning the July 1 prior to the date of application if registration is made prior to April 1, and beginning July 1 subsequent to the date of application if registration is made after April 1 and ending on June 30, 2 years thereafter.

The fee for the issuance or renewal of a public-use registration certificate is \$30.00.

For more information, contact the WI DNR.

If you're coming from out of state, Wisconsin law requires those who use Wisconsin snowmobile trails to display either Wisconsin registration or a snowmobile trail pass. Funds from this program will be designated for use as trail aids and related costs to enhance all Wisconsin snowmobile recreation.

The trail pass may be purchased over the counter at many authorized sales locations or by calling WDNR at 1-888-WDNRINFO.

The \$35.00 non-resident snowmobile trail use pass is valid from July 1st through June 30th.
