Stop the Bleed

Grant promotes MFD initiative

On Aug. 25, 2022, the Merrill Fire Department (MFD) announced the Department was awarded a \$3,250 grant from North Central Regional Trauma Advisory Council (NCRTAC) to purchase Stop the Bleed kits

A Stop the Bleed kit contains the necessary items to control serious bleeding and prevent further blood loss for a victim suffering a traumatic injury. In particular, 62 kits were purchased through the grant. These kits will be distributed throughout the Merrill community specifically to organizations and businesses that have public access Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs). In addition to the kits, they

will offer free Stop the Bleed training to businesses and organizations that request it.

The mission of NCRTAC is to reduce death, disability, and suffering from traumatic injuries and mass casualty events.

NCRTAC awards \$10,000 annually in grants to support projects that align with their goals.

The Merrill Fire Department wrote the grant application for Stop the Bleed kits that could be stored with AEDs in the greater Merrill area.

"We recognize our community

has embraced public access AEDs for years, so citizens are familiar with them and their locations. Adding Stop the Bleed kits to AED locations will better equip the public should the need arise to quickly treat a life-threatening traumatic injury," said Fire Chief Josh Klug.

3000 Years of Longing (Now playing in theatres)



This film is rated R - for language, adult themes, and sexual situations

If you had three wishes, what would they be?

That is the fundamental question posed by 3000 Years of Longing, the newest film by director George Miller of the Mad Max film franchise. Based on the novel, The Djinn in the Nightingale's Eye.

3000 Years of Longing tells the story of Alithea, a literary scholar and solitary woman who, upon her travels in the Grand Bizarre of Istanbul (not Constantinople), happens upon a shop where she purchases a small jar of no consequence, or so she

Trapped within that jar is a djinn who, upon his release, does what djinn's do: grants Alithea three wishes.

We have all read these stories of wishes granted but with unforetold consequences and, being a literary scholar, so has Alithea. So rather than start spouting off wishes, she coaxes the djinn to tell her his

And from there the story unfolds. Told as a fairytale, 3000 Years of Longing covers the djinn's life and imprisonment over the last three millennia. It is a wonderful



set of stories, as he describes his previous masters and their wishes.

3000 Years of Longing hits all the right notes. It is entertaining, interesting, colorful, fun, and the casting is perfect-from Tilda Swinton's frumpy and odd Alithea to Idris Elba's djinn, who is just perfect in that role.

Our modern moviegoing experiences and choices far too often are either animated films or superhero films, so it is refreshing when a smaller film like this comes along to entertain us. Watching this story unfold is not just entertaining, it's pleasurable. So if you get the chance, seek this one out.

Now playing in theatres, 3000 Years of Longing gets 4 full stars out of five possible stars from me. I hope you enjoy it as much as I did.

Don't mow or blow grass into streets and roads

It's against the law and endangers motorcyclists and bicyclists

Residents are reminded that mowing or blowing grass or leaves or any debris into streets or roads is against City of Merrill Ordinance Section 32-94.

While many residents might think, "Well, the street sweeper will clean it up," what they may not think about is that it creates a hazard for those operating motorcycles and bicycles. Grass, leaves, and other debris becomes slippery, especially

Even when not wet from rain, freshly cut grass is 85% water, so it is slick.


While most four-wheel vehicles may not feel the slip, two-wheel vehicles like motorcycles and bicycles can lose control when one or both wheels slip, causing accidents and serious injuries.

Any substance between tires and the road surface causes tires to lose traction. and that can cause drivers to lose control. Sources say that for motorcyclists, driving over fresh cut grass can be as dangerous as driving into an oil slick.

On May 2, 2022, the City of Merrill Street and Weed Commissioner, Ronald R. Liberty, issued a public notice citing the ordinance, among other things.

The ordinance states: "It shall be unlawful for any person to deposit, or cause to be deposited, dumped, sorted, scattered or left any rubbish, stone, wire, earth, ashes, cinders, sawdust, hay, glass, manure, filth, paper, snow, ice, dirt, grass, leaves, construction waste, garbage or other offensive or noxious material in any public street, sidewalk, alley, or upon any public property."




